
Experience Harvest - Wed 8th October from 1pm onwards

Come and see what Wool school children have been doing at Experience Harvest in Holy Rood Church. We celebrate the harvests of the garden, ocean, flock, grain and earth at various sites around the church and give thanks for the fruit of the spirit in the Sukkah.

A Sukkah is a construction built every year by Jews in their gardens, on rooftops or out in the wilderness to remind them of the time Moses led their ancestors to the Promised Land following a pillar of fire by night and a pillar of cloud by day.

People picnic in their Sukkah and sometimes sleep overnight. They remember God's goodness in saving them from slavery in Egypt and providing food, manna and quail and water to drink in the desert wilderness. They call this the Feast of Sukkot or Tabernacles. Do have a wander around and experience harvest giving thanks to God. Rev Jenny
